The Indian National anthem, composed originally in Bengali by Rabindranath Tagore, was adopted in its Hindi version by the Constituent Assembly as the National Anthem of India on 24th January, 1950. It was first sung on 27th December 1911 at the Calcutta session of the Indian National Congress. The complete song consists of five stanzas. The lyrics were rendered into English by Tagore himself. It should be sung within 52 seconds.

Victory, victory, victory to thee.*

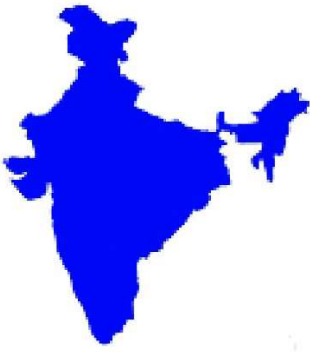
NATIONAL SONG

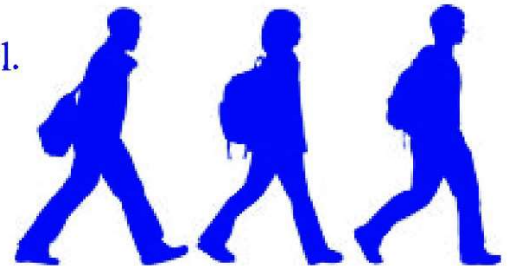
SCHOOL RULES



Students are requested to report to school always in the prescribed uniform. Parents are requested to go through the details of the uniform as given below. Strict adherence to the following specifications is expected from the pupils.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

1. Pupils with unkempt hair would be prevented from attending school.
2. Long sleeved shirts are not allowed except in winter.
3. Wind cheaters and jackets to be allowed only for travel and not within the school premises.
4. Shoes must be black, leather. Boys are to wear shoes with laces. Slip - ons are not allowed
5. The school belt is an essential part of the school uniform.
6. Students must wear their respective house badges and student council badges.
7. Every student must wear / put on his/her identity card to school everyday.
8. Casuals may be allowed on days decided by the school.
9. Trousers must be according to the school pattern.
10. Boys are not allowed to wear coloured vests.
11. For boys, pants are compulsory from Class V onwards.



12. Girls must put on two plaits or braids and tie them with black hair bands.
Boys must have a crew cut hairstyle. Trendy haircuts will not be permitted.
13. No fancy earrings, bangles or finger rings should be worn.
14. Growing of nails and using of nail polish is forbidden.
15. Cell phones and other electronic devices are strictly not allowed in the school.
16. Carrying cosmetics, excluding moisturiser & lip balm is prohibited.
17. Pupils must come to school in neat and well ironed school uniforms. Those coming in crumpled or stained uniforms or unpolished shoes are liable to be marked in discipline card.

Note: Parents/Guardians are requested to observe the aforesaid details; otherwise, the money spent on the prescribed uniform will be wasted.

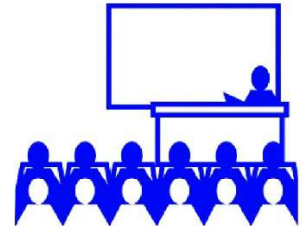

ATTENDANCE



1. Pupils must be punctual for all school activities / classes.
2. Attendance for morning assembly is compulsory. At the end of the assembly, students shall proceed in silence to their classrooms.
3. A student who arrives late will require to bring an explanatory note from the parent/guardian.
4. All explanatory notes for absence/late arrival should be handed over to the class teacher. No one who is late or has been absent on the previous day will be admitted to the class, without the permission of the Principal.
5. (a) Students who are regularly sick and fall short of the required attendance may be asked to leave the school on grounds of physical unfitness.

(b) No leave will be granted during the test week.
6. Students will not be allowed to leave the School early unless Parents/Guardians present a written note to the office. Express permission by the Principal is necessary.

7. In case of infectious diseases the parents are required to submit a medical certificate to the effect that the child is fit to rejoin.
8. Attendance on the first day of the School after vacation is absolutely essential. Pupils who do not join School on this day are liable to pay a fine of Rs 250/- per day.
9. The names of pupils who remain absent without applying for leave for around a week's time may be struck off from the roll. A punitive fine may be imposed on late comers as a measure of deterrent.

GENERAL



1. It is very important that changes in residence/office addresses and telephone numbers are communicated in writing to the office immediately whenever they occur.
2. The school does not hold itself responsible for injuries sustained by pupil while in the school. However, first aid will be rendered immediately and injuries necessitating Hospital/OPD treatment will be attended to, without delay.
3. Pupils are advised not to have private tuitions. Parents are urged to encourage their children to do their daily work diligently and honestly and to pay utmost attention to the studies in the class room. If there is real need for help, contact the principal.
4. Parents are encouraged to have their children undergo medical examination regularly for general well being, especially dental, eye and ear care.
5. Pupils should not bring valuables or money to school. They are also not allowed to bring magazines, pictures or books/CDs/pendrives other than prescribed text books except when asked by the teacher.

6. Students found possessing any reading, viewing or other materials of indecent nature are liable to rustication without notice.
7. Every pupil should take care of his/her personal belongings. School authorities do not assume the responsibility for loss of such belongings.
8. Name of the student and class should be marked on the personal belongings to facilitate recovery when lost in the school premises.

CLASSROOM CLEANLINESS



1. It is the duty of all the students to keep their classrooms and other places in and around the school, clean and in order; they should cultivate the habit of using the dustbin.
2. No pupil is allowed to write on the blackboard unless asked to do so by the teacher.
3. Before leaving the classroom students will pick up waste paper and any unwanted material from the floor and place it in the waste paper basket; will leave desks and chairs in proper arrangement; will put off lights and fans; will close windows; in general the room will be left in a condition to be used again.
4. Every student should take care of the school property; intended or neglectful damage to school property is a serious breach of school discipline and will have to be made good by the defaulting students.
5. Damage done even by accident should be reported at once to the class teacher.

LIBRARY



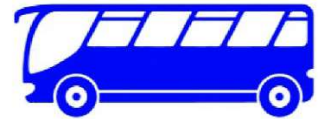
1. Library books are issued to the pupils once a week on the day fixed for each class. They must be returned after a week and if required may be re-issued.
2. Students must acquire the habit of reading as it is important for their educational process. Parents are required to urge their children to cultivate this habit.
3. Students are expected to take care of the library books. Writing or marking on a book is strictly forbidden. Damage/loss of books while in possession of the student will have to be made good by the student in whose name the book has been issued.
4. A Book review on those books borrowed must be submitted while returning the book.
5. A fine of Rs.1.00 will be collected from the student for everyday after the due date of returning the book to the library.
6. If in case, a library book is lost, it is the responsibility of the student to replace the same book (newly purchased from the market) or the library will collect the cost of the book plus processing fee of 25% from the cost of the book. For example if the cost of book is 100/- then the student will have to pay Rs.125.00 (cost + processing fee).



SCHOOL DIARY

1. Every pupil must possess a copy of the school diary which should be brought to school every day. Apart from entering legibly the name and other personal data, pupils should not enter in it anything except what relates to School work.
2. School diary is to be preserved carefully and no page from it should be destroyed.
3. Pupils must show to their parents/guardians whenever they are given notes by the Principal or teacher and obtain their signature. Entries by parents/guardians should also be shown to the Principal/Teacher.

TRANSPORT / BUS RULES



1. Students who avail the school bus service should report to the assigned pick-up point atleast 5 minutes before the stipulated time.
2. A pupil will not be permitted to board a bus other than the one to which he/she is assigned.
3. Students will board the bus in an orderly manner, giving due priority to younger students.
4. Any request to change the bus route/stop must be submitted to the transport incharge prior to the change that is to be made. Bus monitors shall be assigned to help maintain discipline.
5. The following acts are considered serious violations:
 - a) Discourtesy and disobedience to the driver or conductor.
 - b) Changing places frequently while the bus is in motion.
 - c) Discourtesy to other children.
 - d) Pushing and jostling when boarding the bus.
 - e) Trying to distract the bus driver's attention.
 - f) Destroying bus property.

Note: Payment for damage will be required before the offender is reinstated on the bus.

6. In the event of a child being involved in a disciplinary problem, the Principal, at his/her discretion, may take any disciplinary action, even suspending the offender from the use of bus.
7. The bus service is liable to be withdrawn or changed from any area as and when it is not found to be feasible. Transport charges vary according to the distances.
8. The school is not responsible for any student who boards a wrong bus from school by intent or goes to another student's house without explicit information from the parent verified by the school authority.

DISCIPLINE

1. Parents / pupils (individually or collectively) are forbidden to give gifts to teachers. Neither parties, nor gift presentations by students or parents on birthdays of students or such occasions are allowed. A token gift of a flower or a sweet may be allowed.
2. Collection of funds for whatever use is forbidden without prior permission of the Principal. Students shall not sell or take orders for any merchandise in school or in the name of the School.
3. Pupils are required to behave politely and avoid use of indecent language or actions injurious to the feelings of fellow students, teachers or others in this school. Any such behaviour indicative of hurting others', caste or community will attract serious disciplinary action.
4. No student shall indulge in any of the following practices namely,
 - (a) disfiguring or otherwise damaging any School property
 - (b) smoking
 - (c) any form of gambling
 - (d) use of drugs or intoxicants, except on prescription by a doctor.
 - (e) rowdyism and rude behaviour
 - (f) use of violence in any form
 - (g) casteism and communalism
 - (h) use of obscene language and/or causing hurt to the reputation of others.
 - (i) Playing truant during classes which will be viewed as a serious offence.
5. Serious violation of the rules and regulations and the discipline is punishable and may result including removal or expulsion from the School. Such action will normally follow a written warning either as a note to the parents or in the discipline card maintained by Class teacher, to facilitate improvement in conduct.
6. Immediate suspension and/or even rustication will follow if the continued presence of the defaulting student is damaging to the physical and moral well-being of

other students and of the School, or if the violation is punishable seriously at the Board level, such as unfair practice at the examination.

7. In the absence of the Teacher from the classroom, pupils are required to observe silence and obey the Monitor of the class. While travelling by school bus, they are expected to follow the instructions of the conductor.
8. Students are not allowed to enter classrooms other than their own.
9. Pupils may be required to take part in various co-curricular and extra-curricular activities even outside School hours. When so required, participation will be deemed compulsory.
10. Staying away from mandatory school functions, including Annual day and Sports Day without prior permission and/or justification will be considered a discipline default.
11. Each student's safety is a major concern of the School. Therefore the following should be strictly observed.
 - (a) Students should wear the identity card with the school uniform.
 - (b) Parents of primary students are required to teach their children their names, address and telephone numbers.
 - (c) If the child has to go to a place other than the regular one, a note from the parents must be sent to School requesting permission and stating the reason for the child to go to a different address after school.
12. Students are responsible to school authorities for their conduct not only in the School but also for their general behaviour outside. Any report or observation of objectionable conduct outside the School on the part of the pupils will make them liable to disciplinary action. Through their good behavior, they enhance the prestige of the School and family.
13. Parents are advised to inform, the Principal about any problem they face regarding their children keeping in mind that it is only with sincerity and openness of the

parents that the School will be able to help their child to become a well adjusted person with good character and right attitudes. Needless to say that disclosures made will be treated with utmost confidentiality.

14. A student involved in any incident even outside the School which brings discredit to the school either because of unpleasant nature or inviting criminal or legal action by police or the court will be dismissed from school without further enquiry.
15. Any student found travelling at odd hours with fellow students in a motorised vehicle without parents' permission and/or without a proper valid licence will be liable for disciplinary action, if this is brought to the notice of the School authorities.
16. No child can come to the school driving a two wheeler or a four wheeler.
17. Students from Grade-6 are not allowed to wear color dress on their birthdays. Distribution of chocolates and other gift items on birthdays is prohibited.
18. Usage of Plastic carry bags inside the school premises is banned.
19. Munching "Chewing gum", "Chocolates" and other such eatables is prohibited inside the School bus and School premises.

Note

1. If students don't follow the rules and regulations of the school they will be terminated immediately.
2. In the T.C of such students the reason for termination will be mentioned in **BOLD** letters.
